A Final Challenge: Corruption Taught as a Way of Life
2 Peter 2:10b-22

Probably the last work of the Apostle Peter before his death at the hands of the Roman Emperor Nero. 2 Peter is Peter's farewell speech. His final challenge to the people of Jesus. This is Peter's passionate conviction that God loves the world and is determined to rescue us. As such, God will confront and deal with evil to open the way for God's new future.

“I don't think that means what you think it means” (2 Peter 2:10b – 16)

“Bold and willful, they do not tremble as they blaspheme the glorious ones...Forsaking the right way, they have gone astray...” (2 Peter 2:10b, 15a).

“I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, to watch out for those who cause divisions and create obstacles contrary to the doctrine that you have been taught; avoid them. For such persons do not serve our Lord Christ, but their own appetites, and by smooth talk and flattery they deceive the hearts of the naïve” (Romans 16:17-18).

Peter, Paul, the Placekicker, and Proverbs (2 Peter 2:17 – 22)

“They promise them freedom, but they themselves are slaves of corruption. For whatever overcomes a person, to that they are enslaved” (2 Peter 2:19).
